• By-laws amendment proposal:

Section VI part A states:

2. Advoz Introduction



Chris Fitz, Executive Director, Community Engagement of Advoz described his organization and services they offer. Services include, mediation services and restorative justice practices working with the juvenile court system. The committee brainstormed ways in which SoWe could partner with Advoz. 1. Jim Gerhart – Manor St History Project

Jim Gerhart presented to the committee regarding a history project he is working on for Lancasterhistory.org focusing on Manor St and SoWe. Housing Committee

1. FY 2019-20 SoWe Budget for Housing Committee

The committee discussed funding priorities for the 2019-2020 Fiscal Year. The committee recommended increasing LHOP down payment assistance for first-time home buyers in SoWe. Allyson Wells from habitat agreed to see if additional funding would be needed for the Affordable Home Repair program. The committee brainstormed ideas for landlord incentives to create quality affordable rentals such as an rental rehab program or an educational program for landlords.

2. Lenny Walton - Rental Property Acquisition

Lenny Walton informed the group that he and his partners are interested in creating affordable rental properties in the SoWe neighborhood. The committee agreed that there is a need for such house and agreed to act as a sounding board to help identify properties. Mr. Walton agreed to come back to the committee when the group was incorporated and ready to purchase. Properties.

3. LHOP/SoWe Everyone Deserves a Place Called Home Forum Jake Thorsen stated that LHOP is planning to host a forum to highlight their housing programs in SoWe as well as answer any questions or concerns the neighbors have. Mr. Thorsen agreed to email details out to the group.

4. Habitat for Humanity Updates and Report

Allyson Wells stated that Habitat will be hosting a lead safety workshop in SoWe on 1/26 at the SoWe Office. Ms. Wells also stated that Habitat is working with two purchasers to close on properties on N. Christian. Habitat currently has applications open for the purchase of one home.

5. Other items from committee members

Mr. Thorsen stated that LHOP, Lancaster Equity CDC, Lancaster Land Bank Authority, and the City of Lancaster are seeking state funding to purchase 5-6 scattered site affordable rental properties. Mr. Thorsen stated that they are currently identifying properties to purchase.



Parks and Public Realm Committee

1. Lancaster Public Art and Culliton Park

Jo Davis from Public Art presented on public art plans for Culliton park. Salina Almanzar will be doing phase II work in the summer in Culliton park. The committee will support Salina in her efforts at the park, which will include projects and getting feedback from community members. She will need volunteers. Rachel will loop Salina into the committee meeting schedule once Salina's contract begins. Salina will have a start date of March 4th, her regular schedule will be twice a month for Art Pop in the park again this year. Parks committee members should plan on being present for those events.

The park renovation design is currently being worked on and will possibly be out to bid in the spring. Construction will be a yearlong project but phased and Salina's project could continue through construction. Rachel will share the power point with the Friends of Culliton.

Jo mentioned that she knows someone in the department of social work at Millersville and asked if the committee needed a graduate intern for the committee. The committee will ask for an intern if there are specific projects that the intern could help with.

The committee will communicate with Jo Davis until Salina is under contract with regards to park updates.

2. Pocket Parks

The committee then discussed pocket parks.

Two possible sites were identified: one at Christ Lutheran and one at 710 St. Joseph Street. Karl, Jake and Rachel will set up a meeting with Christ Lutheran to discuss their site for a possible pocket park. There is also a city owned property at 710 St. Joseph street that could be a possible site for a pocket park in the future. We should do some research on common issues that would come with starting a pocket park. Before meeting with Christ Lutheran, we will gather photos of sites throughout the city where there are pocket parks or welcoming outdoor areas for the public, specifically those done by other churches in order to brainstorm with Christ Lutheran.

3. Trash Receptacles

SoWe ordered 15 trash cans, the committee will seek sponsors for those trash cans.



The committee will work over a 6-8 week timeline to find locations for trash cans. We will do this via email with each other.

4. SoWe Budget

The Committee needs to work on getting budgets to finance committee. Ideas include events at the park. We will have formal budget recommendations at the next committee meeting.

5. Other Items

Rachel will contact Carole Kirchner about possibly coordinating spring easter egg hunt with the Rec. The next meeting will be February 20th at 7 pm at the Boys and Girls Club.

Jake Thorsen informed the group of a grant opportunity through the Lancaster Bicycle Club. The committee was in favor of pursuing the grant to purchase and install bike racks through the neighborhood.
